# A History of Bayview

- Bayview's founding: an attempt to push back against dispossession
  - 1800's - Ho-Chunk
  - 1960's - Greenbush (Jewish, Italian, and Black)
- Founded in 1966, welcomed residents in 1971
- 102 units of affordable housing and a community center
- Major resettlement destination for Hmong refugees after Vietnam War
- Legacy of diversity with immigrants and refugees from all over the world.
